A MESSAGE FROM YOUR VICAR

GENEROUS CHURCHES

Over the last couple of years the Diocese of York has been working on a new initiative called "Generous Churches: Making and Nurturing Disciples". One of the five areas of focus is "Partnership" - an area in which I have a particular interest.

I once remember reading, in a book about Church growth, that we do not grow our churches by trying to make them bigger. Our churches will grow as we try to make them better.

It is my belief that one important way in which our churches become better is by working in partnership with individuals and other groups and organisations in our villages or towns. As we look forward into 2014 and beyond, it is vital that we look for opportunities to engage with more and more people living and working in our local communities, as well as build upon the relationships that have already been established.

Whenever we look at new building work or any refurbishment of our church buildings, we also need to take into account what it is we hope to do or achieve in the coming months/years.

As more people become involved with the local church - in whatever way they feel able to do so - then more can be done to meet the needs of those in our local communities and parishes. I'm convinced that whatever we may want to do to improve our churches and make them relevant to people in the $21^{\rm st}$ century requires that we work in partnership with others - working together to make our local neighbourhoods and parishes better places to live and work.

The focus of this year's Lent Course in Waggoners and Woldsburn will be "The five marks for growing churches" - a course specifically designed by our Archdeacon and the Diocesan training team for Lent 2014. I do hope as many people as possible will join us - the dates, times and venues will be advertised in the next Deanery magazine.

As we focus on mission and outreach I'm sure we will be encouraged and can look forward with renewed hope and with a positive outlook.

Cut the cost of your heating oil and spread the cost

Humber & Wolds Rural Community Council (HWRCC) and Hull and East Yorkshire Credit Union (HEYCU) have come together to help residents spread the cost of their heating oil. Many residents are already saving money on their fuel bill by joining the 'Cheaper Heating Oil Together'. Now, they have the opportunity to spread the cost over an extended period too! Spread the cost by joining a regular savings scheme or apply for a Credit Union Loan to spread the cost of oil over an extended period. As the rising cost of living continues to put pressure on household budgets, HWRCC, in partnership with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, is delivering the YORSwitch, 'Cheaper Oil Together Scheme' that aims to save its members money though bulk-buying oil for residents and businesses in the region. HWRCC is collaborating with HEYCU in the hope that residents will take advantage of its competitive saving and loan facilities to make purchasing oil through the scheme easier. Surface Water Flooding

The recent heavy rain has resulted in some areas of the road network within Middleton being covered in standing water. Would drivers please drive slowly through such areas to reduce damage or flooding to adjoining property caused by large waves of water from faster vehicles. The heavy rain is also transporting large amounts of silt into the drains, if you have a surface drain near your property please check that it has not become silted up as this could lead to standing water problems in the future.
